

## **The SVAO applauds the NEW BRUNSWICK decision to do away with front licence plates.**

*FREDERICTON (GNB) – The requirement of front licence plates on passenger and light commercial vehicles in New Brunswick will be eliminated July 15, 2019.*

*“The government committed to eliminating front licence plates, and we are following through on that,” said Public Safety Minister Carl Urquhart. “Once the amendments and updated regulations are proclaimed, motorists will only require a licence plate on the back of their vehicle.”*

*The change will remove the requirement to display two plates on vehicles weighing less than 4,500 kilograms. Vehicles that will still be required to display a front plate include tractor trailers, buses, school buses, fire trucks, dump trucks and bucket trucks.*



It seems that New Brunswick police (along with Quebec and other places) can operate in a province where light duty vehicles without the front plates are allowed. The Ontario Association of Chiefs of Police are the most vocal opponents of our province not losing the front plate.

**Perhaps it is time for enthusiasts to ask their MPPs to question the recent Ontario governments decision not to go along with a similar plea from hobbyists in our province.**
